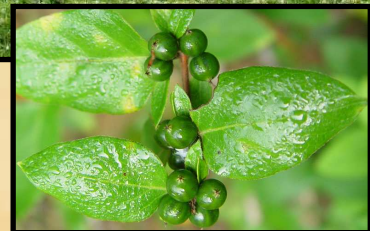

Japanese Honeysuckle

Lonicera japonica

Unwanted for: Killing young trees by wrapping around them. Forming dense mats in the canopies of trees, preventing undergrowth. Outcompeting native vegetation.

Plant Type: A semi-evergreen woody vine with opposite, dark green leaves (lobed or smooth) and fragrant, tubular white to yellow flowers that appear in April.

What you can do:

- Hand pull entire vines and root systems in small patches.
- Mow large patches regularly to prevent regrowth.
- Apply herbicide.
